Title: Sexual Entertainment Venues

Summary and Conclusions:

This report deals with new legislation which enables local authorities to licence sexual entertainment venues, for example lap dancing clubs.

Recommendation:

That Members agree to adopt the amendments made to Schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 by Section 27 of the Policing and Crime Act 2009 to enable the Borough Council to licence sexual entertainment venues with an operative date of 1st October, 2010.

Background Paper: Letter from Home Office Home Office Guidance

<u>Report</u>

Barrow Borough Council adopted Schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 many years ago. This allows the authority to licence sex shops and sex cinemas as sex establishments.

Schedule 3 of the above Act has now been amended by Section 27 of the Policing and Crime Act 2009 and as a result from 6th April 2010 local authorities can adopt additional powers to regulate lap dancing clubs and similar venues.

The amendment introduces a new category of sex establishment called 'sexual entertainment venues', which if adopted by a local authority, will require premises which provide 'relevant entertainment', such as lap dancing, to obtain a sex establishment licence. There is an exemption for premises that provide relevant entertainment on an infrequent basis.

The purpose of the new legislation is to empower local communities where there are concerns about lap dancing clubs opening in their neighbourhoods. Under the new regime, local people will be able to oppose application on wider grounds than is currently allowed under the Licensing Act 2003. Local Authorities are also able to set a limit on the number of lap dancing clubs they consider for a particular locality.

<u>Part One</u> (R) Agenda Item 1 The legislation is not mandatory and there are currently no lap dancing establishments in the area, however, applications may be received in the future and if the local authority then wished to adopt the legislation, there is a requirement that if the legislation is adopted after 6th April 2011, the local authority would have to consult local people about whether they should do so as soon as is reasonably practicable after that date.

I would ask Members to consider adopting the new provisions to enable the authority to licence sexual entertainment venues under Schedule 3 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended by Section 27 of the Policing and Crime Act 2009.

If adopted there is a requirement for an authority to publish a notice for two consecutive weeks in a local newspaper, the first publication not being later than 28 days before the date for the provisions to come into force in the area. I would therefore suggest that if adopted an operative date for the provisions to come into effect be set at 1st October, 2010.
